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Highly anticipated One Central opens Downtown

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One Central, the Downtown mixed-use project on the northeast corner of Central Avenue and First Street that has been in the works for over a year and a half, is open for business.

The first residents will move in next week, beginning the process of filling 68 available studio and two-bedroom apartments. About one-third of the units have already been leased, according to One Central Director of Operations David Stroud.

The ground-level will be occupied by several businesses, including Deep Space Coffee, which is relocating from 504 Central Ave. SW, according to Business First reporting. The on-site parking garage has over 400 parking spots.

Developers include <u>Jerry Mosher</u>, Tony Pisto of Maranatha Construction and <u>Dale Armstrong</u> of TLC Plumbing & Utility. The building features 44,000 square feet of street-level commercial space and over 20,000-square-feet of patio space. Albuquerque-based <u>Klinger Constructors</u> was the general contractor and Albuquerque-based <u>SMPC Architects</u> was the architecture firm. SMPC collaborated with local architecture firm Studio Southwest Architects, which provided design for the apartment interiors.

The city of Albuquerque <u>contributed over \$17.5 million to the estimated \$40 million project</u>, money which came from lodgers' tax funds, general obligation bonds and parking revenue bonds, as well as land valued at \$1.4 million.

An industrial revenue bond package including property and gross receipts tax breaks was also approved by Bernalillo County, the <u>Albuquerque Journal reported</u>.

Other commercial tenants include an Italian restaurant and an ax-throwing company, Stroud said.
